Many know Mark Schultz as the platinum-selling, award-winning artist whose career has spanned two decades with thirteen #1 hits. "I wanted to write a song for birth mothers so they could hear how grateful I am to my own birth mom and how she made the choice to give me life." And that's exactly how the song was used, to encourage expectant mothers across the country who were in crisis. Mark has a passion for benefit concerts because it's a chance to tell his story and to give back to the very organizations that helped save his life.
